This is to give notice that the Town of  
Rosepine has determined that the fol-  
lowing proposed action under the FY  
2024 Louisiana Community Develop-  
ment Block Grant is located in the 100  
year floodplain and wetland, and the  
Town of Rosepine will be identifying  
and evaluating practicable alternatives  
to locating the action in the floodplain/  
wetland and the potential impacts on  
the floodplain and wetland from the pro-  
posed action, as required by Executive  
Order 11988 and/or 11990, in accor-  
dance with HUD regulations at 24 CFR  
55.20 Subpart C Procedures for Mak-  
ing Determinations on Floodplain Man-  
agement and Protection of Wetlands.

There are three primary purposes for  
this notice. First, people who may be  
affected by activities in floodplains  
and wetlands, and those who have an  
interest in the protection of the natural  
environment should be given an oppor-  
tunity to express their concerns and  
provide information about these areas.  
Commenters are encouraged to offer  
alternative sites outside of the flood-  
plains and wetlands, alternative meth-  
ods to serve the same project purpose,  
and methods to minimize and mitigate  
impacts. Second, an adequate public  
notice program can be an important  
public educational tool. The dissemi-  
nation of information and request for  
public comment about floodplains and  
wetlands can facilitate and enhance  
Federal efforts to reduce the risks and  
impacts associated with the occupancy  
and modification of these special areas.  
Third, as a matter of fairness, when the  
Federal government determines it will  
participate in actions taking place in  
floodplains/wetlands, it must inform  
those who may be put at greater or  
continued risk.

Written comments must be received  
by the Town of Rosepine at the follow-
